Theme: Tudors

As readers and writers we will be reading and writing descriptions and information texts about the Tudors. We will read *Treason* by Berlie Doherty and work on a short animation - *Road's End* by Bri Meyer. We will complete different types of writing based on these genres. *Treason* will help the children explore the life of Tudors and the importance of having a title to a name. We will research and write about the history of Tudors and learn about how life has changed over time. We will continue to develop our reading and spelling skills through our daily Sounds-Write phonics lessons and our Guided Reading sessions which will also be closely linked to the above. We will continue to bring home a personal reading book to read and talk about with adults at home every day. We also have a trip to Hampton Court Palace where we will explore further about the Tudors.

As geographers we will be looking at the distribution of natural resources and how we get our food and power from. We will also consider how we can conserve our natural resources for the world. To link to our topic, we will also explore the Tudor world through maps.

As historians we will be investigating the history of Tudors. We will look into Tudor fashion and its cultural, social and economical history. We will be exploring chronology where we will be developing a secure knowledge and understanding of British history. We will also be looking into new religious ideas which was a significant turning point in British history as well as exploring the cause and consequence of these. We will also work on how Britain has influenced and been influenced by the wider world.

As scientists we will compare and group together everyday materials on the basis of their properties. We will build on and explore reversible changes, including evaporating, filtering, sieving, melting and dissolving, recognising that melting and dissolving are different processes. We will then focus on the topic Earth and Space where we will look into different planets, stars and their movements in relation to each other within the solar system.

The Big Question: What was life like for the Tudors?

Through our English, topic and guided reading lessons, we look at the life of the Tudor royal family and how the decisions made by Henry VIII affected life for his own family and that of his subjects, how ordinary people lived including food, jobs and clothing. We use maps to study the trade routes across the world and how the Wars of the Roses changed the course of history.

We will be studying how Henry VIII changed the religion of a country and how that impacts on England today.

As mathematicians we will be following the curriculum designed by the NCETM to ensure that any gaps in our learning are addressed. We will be exploring decimals and how they are represented as fractions. We will also be learning about money where we will be learning converting between pound and pence as well as calculating the change. We will then explore negative numbers and move on to calculating using short multiplication and division strategies. As a school, we will be taking part in the NCETM Mastering Number Programme which will ensure all children are fluent in basic number facts so they have a secure base for their learning in maths.

Across the curriculum

As musicians we will be learning to play the recorder. We will also be perfecting our performance skills for our Christmas Concert.

As artists we will be painting self-portraits making links to our Tudors topic. We will also be doing 3D work making models linked to our Geography topic Mountains.

As computing specialists we will be developing our skills in digital literacy and online safety and exploring websites. As part of Computer Science, we will be decomposing problems into smaller parts to design an algorithm for a specific outcome and use them to write a program.

As design technologists we be designing and making Tudor biscuits linked to our History topic. As well as this we will be looking at a Mars rover, a motor vehicle that travels across the surface of the planet Mars upon arrival.

As sports enthusiasts we will be developing our movement skills in Fitness and cricket.

As explorers of faiths and beliefs we will be exploring the question, 'What does it mean if Christians believe God to be holy and loving?'

Our PSHE curriculum will include work on families and relationships. This will include Anti-Bullying Week.
